

For the Love of an Imperative Verb John 2:13-22

¹³The Passover of the Jews was near, and Jesus went up to Jerusalem. ¹⁴In the temple he found people selling cattle, sheep, and doves, and the money changers seated at their tables. ¹⁵Making a whip of cords, he drove all of them out of the temple, both the sheep and the cattle. He also poured out the coins of the money changers and overturned their tables. ¹⁶He told those who were selling the doves, “**Take** these things **out** [ἄρατε, **árate**] of here! Stop **making** [ποιεῖτε, **poieíte**] my Father’s house a marketplace!” ¹⁷His disciples remembered that it was written, “Zeal for your house will consume me.” ¹⁸The Jews then said to him, “What sign can you show us for doing this?” ¹⁹Jesus answered them, “**Destroy** [λύσατε, **lýsate**] this temple, and in three days I will raise it up.” ²⁰The Jews then said, “This temple has been under construction for forty years, and will you raise it up in three days?” ²¹But he was speaking of the temple of his body. ²²After he was raised from the dead, his disciples remembered that he had said this; and they believed the scripture and the word that Jesus had spoken. ποιεῖτε, **poieíte**; *vb: pres act imperative 2nd pers pl* from ποιέω:

translations: **making** [NRSV89], **make** [NGEINT]

translations: **destroy** [NRSV89, NGEINT]

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
